Important notes about ARRL Foundation Scholarships:

- 1. All applicants must hold a FCC amateur radio license.
- 2. Most scholarships, except the Goldfarb Memorial Scholarship, are awarded for only one year.
- 3. Applicants should apply only for those scholarships for which they qualify.
- 4. The Goldfarb Memorial Scholarship is available to high school seniors only.
- 5. The Goldfarb Scholarship requires a separate application form (available on this website).
- 6. A current FAFSA or SAR form MUST accompany a Goldfarb Scholarship application.
- 7. All applications must be accompanied by a recent high school (or equivalent) or college transcript. Applications without transcripts will not be considered. Transcripts need not accompany the application form and may be mailed separately.
- 8. The scholarship application period opens on October 1 of each year and closes on February 1.
- 9. All applications must be postmarked on or before February 1.
- 10. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
